

#### 3. Material information

The Arizona fireplace is made from sturdy, painted steel, designed to withstand outdoor conditions. The painted finish serves to protect the steel from rust, moisture, and other environmental factors, but still requires periodic upkeep to ensure its longevity.

## **Monthly Maintenance**:

Apply Protective Coating: While the fireplace is painted, additional protection can be gained by applying
a heat-resistant sealant or paint to the surface at least once a season (or as needed based on usage and
weather exposure).

# **Long-Term Storage**:

• Cover or Store Indoors: When not in use, especially during the off-season or in rainy weather, store the fireplace in a dry place or use a waterproof cover to protect it from the elements.

Allow the fire to burn out naturally. Never douse the fire with water, as sudden temperature changes can
cause thermal shock and damage the fireplace. Wait until the fireplace is completely cool before cleaning
or moving it.

## 7. Safety precautions
